Golfers try to break world tee-off record

Hundreds of golfers around the state are planning to tee off at the same time in September to potentially break a world record.

Thomas Bianca, owner of North American Golf Experience, said he hopes at least 2,000 golfers at more than 50 courses hit balls simultaneously Sept. 17.

"The more the merrier," Bianca said. "We'll put Colorado in the history books."

According to Guinness World Records, the record for multiple venues is held by 1,453 golfers

in Singapore who hit balls simultaneously in 2006.

Bianca said an adjudicator will monitor the Colorado attempt and cameras will be at each location.

Participating golf courses include John F. Kennedy in Denver, Fox Hollow in Lakewood and Foothills in Littleton.

Bianca, whose late mother had Alzheimer's disease, said funds from the event will help establish a nonprofit organization aimed at improving and raising awareness about nursing homes.
